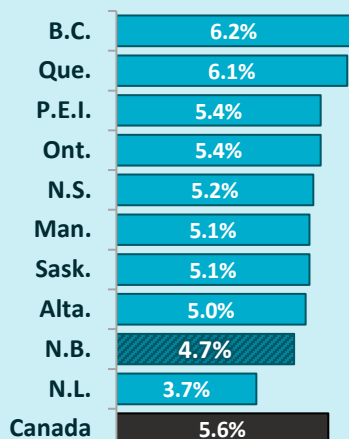

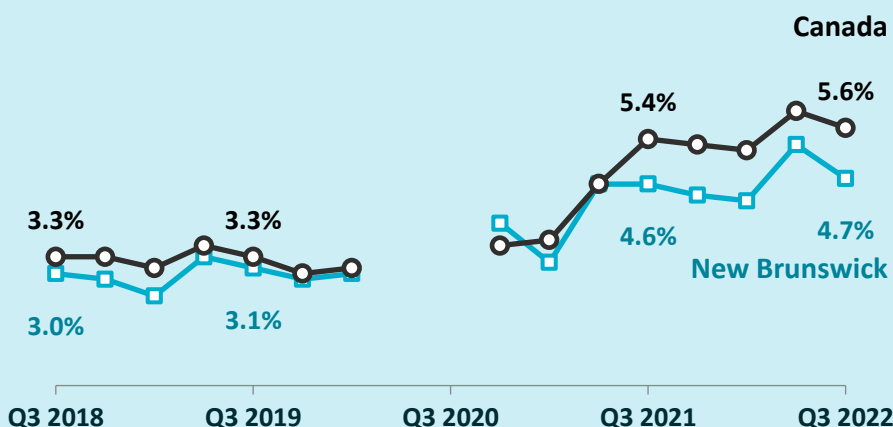

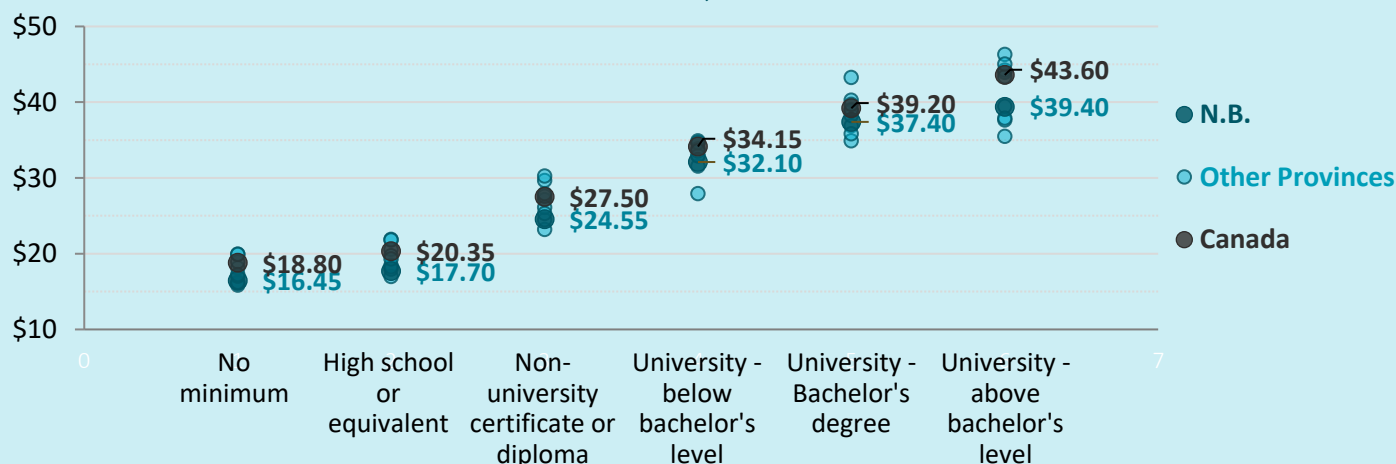
Vacancy Rate by Province

(1) A job is considered vacant if it meets the following conditions: it is vacant on the reference date or will become vacant during the month; there are tasks to be carried out during the month for the job in question; and the employer is actively seeking a worker outside the organization to fill the job.

(2) This ratio tells how many unemployed individuals are available for each vacant position and is a measure of the labour market tightness.

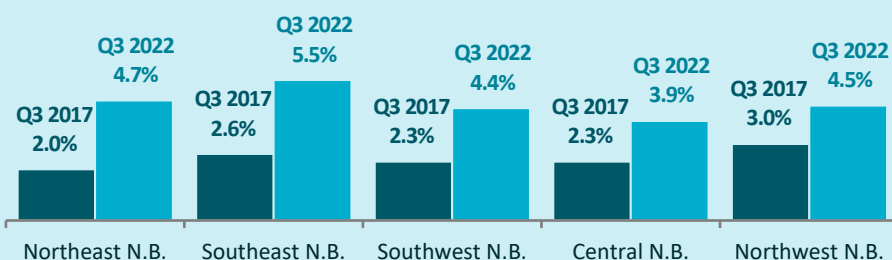
