# **April is Emergency Communications Month**

Last week's Emergency Management and Response – Information Sharing and Analysis Center InfoGram highlighted the value and recognition of emergency communications:

April is dedicated to all things related to emergency communications. In 2022, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) began observing <a href="Emergency Communications Month"><u>Emergency Communications Month</u></a> in April to recognize the role of emergency communications as a vital function. Since 1994, <a href="National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week">National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week</a> (NPSTW) has been observed during the second week of April. This year's NPSTW will be observed from <a href="April 9-15">April 9-15</a>. In collaboration with stakeholders and national associations, the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration's (NHTSA's) National 911 Program has compiled resources you can use to celebrate public safety telecommunicators for the commitment, dedication and critical life-saving services they provide every day:

- <u>"Thank you" Letter from NHTSA's National 911 Program</u>. This personal letter from the National 911 Program acknowledges Telecommunicators Week, thanks all telecommunicators for their commitment to helping people in times of need and honors the work they do to keep our communities safe. The letter may be replicated and posted in your center to thank telecommunicators for the difference they make.
- <u>Customizable Certificate</u>. This certificate can be personalized with the name and location
  of the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) to recognize the skill, dedication and service
  of its telecommunicators on behalf of the National 911 Program.
